ASSISTED COMPETITIVE EMPLOYMENT (ACE)

ACE programs provide supported employment services to adults 18 years of age and older with a history of serious mental illness who reside in any borough of NYC. ACE helps with rapid job search and placement, followed by ongoing support while the individual is employed in order to keep the job. Supported employment services are delivered using the enhanced evidence-based practice model of Individual Placement and Support (IPS). The basic tenet of IPS is that regardless of psychiatric disability, skills, experience and personal history, anyone who wishes to work must be served.

 - o Identification of strengths and challenges to employment
 - Goal setting
 - Formulation of an employment plan
- Job Readiness
 - Resume building
 - Interview coaching
 - Understanding work appropriate dress and behavior
 - o Referrals to education/remediation services
- Job search and placement
- Ongoing support to ensure job retention
 - With program participant's consent, collaborate with employers and the person's providers
 - o individual, group and telephone coaching
 - o Benefits counseling

These programs offer time-limited, paid, on-the-job pre-vocational training in order to help people with serious mental illness who have little to no work experience develop soft employment skills. These include skills such as attendance, teamwork, task completion and organization. The programs actually operate businesses which provide the work setting in an integrated environment.

EDUCATION SUPPORT SERVICES

Education Support Service programs help those wishing to start or return to and complete any formal education geared towards targeted employment goals. Formal education includes Test Assessing Secondary Completion high school equivalency (TASC, formerly known as GED) preparation programs, formal vocational training such as culinary arts schools, peer specialist training and post-secondary education. Education Support Services also help those currently enrolled in a formal education program wanting additional support in order to graduate. These programs are for adults 18 years of age and older with a history of serious mental illness who reside in any borough of NYC.

- School Readiness
 - Assistance in overcoming barriers commonly faced by individuals with psychiatric disabilities including stigma from students or instructors

 - o Referrals to education/remediation services
 - Negotiating the benefits and risks of disclosure
- Ongoing support to ensure graduation
 - O With program participant's consent, collaborate with teachers and the person's providers
 - Academic skill building
 - Resource attainment
 - o Educating faculty and staff about mental health conditions and challenges
 - Advocacy accessing necessary accommodations

ACCREDITED CLUBHOUSE PROGRAMS

Clubhouse programs are an evidence-based model whose objective is to assist individuals with their recovery, develop or re-establish a sense of self-esteem and group affiliation, and support their reintegration into a meaningful role in the community. The model is based on a work-ordered day in which members and staff support clubhouse operations without a hierarchical relationship. This is essential for providing structure, particularly to those who have been isolating or have been recently discharged from hospitalization or incarceration. Formal Clubhouse as opposed to Psychosocial Clubs have been accredited by the certifying body Clubhouse International which audits the programs to ensure fidelity to the model and is conducted every three years for programs to maintain accreditation.

- Opportunities for members to learn various skills while operating the clubhouse including clerical, culinary, and janitorial skills
- Employment support services including paid internships in an integrated setting, supported and independent employment
- Education support services to pursue and graduate from formal programs
- Evening/weekend social and recreational programming
- Case management

PSYCHOSOCIAL CLUB PROGRAMS

Psychosocial Club programs provide support services to assist individuals with their recovery, develop or re-establish a sense of self-esteem and group affiliation, and support their reintegration into a meaningful role in the community. The model is based on a work-ordered day in which members and staff support clubhouse operations without a hierarchical relationship. This is essential for providing structure, particularly to those who have been isolating or have been recently discharged from hospitalization or incarceration as well as older adults. Psychosocial Clubs are now required to actively pursue accreditation by Clubhouse International in order to transition to a formal evidence-based Clubhouse model.

- Employment support services including paid internships in an integrated setting, supported and independent employment
- Education support services to pursue and graduate from formal programs

ADVOCACY PROGRAMS

Advocacy programs provide both individual and systems advocacy services through offering direct and indirect support. Its primary aim is to enhance recovery by removing impediments to needed services within their communities and empowering individuals by providing education on self and system advocacy. Advocacy services aim to enhance program participant's ability to manage their mental illness while reaching their life goals. Services include assistance with referrals and linkages, community integration, support groups, assessments, mental health systems training and public advocacy for systems changes, supportive housing applications, mental health education and obtaining benefits and entitlements.

These programs provide peer support services whose objective is to facilitate a smooth transition for someone discharging from psychiatric hospitalization. Peer Specialists assist people with referrals and linkages, developing a crisis prevention plan, motivation and encouragement among other supports. The relationship and support begins before the person is actually discharged and continues for a time-limited period after the person has integrated into the community.

CRISIS RESPITE PROGRAMS

These short-term crisis respites provide a safe and comfortable place to stay when someone is in a psychiatric crisis and does not wish to stay at home or go into a hospital. The respite services are provided primarily by Peer Specialists who assist guests with such supports as crisis prevention planning, referrals, linkages, support groups and wellness coaching. The goal of this service is to divert hospitalization and prevent the crisis from worsening.

OUTREACH PROGRAMS

Outreach services provide time-limited supports in the community including psychiatric assessments and rehabilitation, referrals and linkages and public education on mental health.
